harshest on Earth.
Temperatures in winter
can drop to -60 degrees
F.

Inuit

Wore furry
boots, parkas,
long underwear,
goggles

Inuit

In the winter, they made
igloos of snow. In the
summer they might make
a tupik out of animal
skin and bone.

Inuit

Ate meats from
whale, seals,
walruses, fish,
reindeer, caribou,
and other animals

Inuit

Migrated
to Arizona

Hopi

The climate was
extremely hot, usually
topping 100 degrees for
the summer. Land is
sandy desert, very dry
and little rain

Hopi

Men wore
breechcloths or
kilts, women wore
shawls, leggings

Hopi

Lived in Pueblos made
of adobe, apartment
buildings that were often
built onto the sides of
mesas

Hopi

Corn was
their staple
crop

Hopi

Migrated to
northwest
coast---Washington,
Oregon, Northern
California

Kwakiutl

Climate is warm,
rainy, and very
breezy; temperatures
get cooler as you
move east

Kwakiutl

Wore breechcloth,
tunic, moccasins,
robes, apron-type
dress, and cedar
hats

Kwakiutl

Lived in cedar-plank
houses; windowless
and painted with
images

Kwakiutl

Ate salmon, sea
otters, seals, deer,
bear, oysters,
berries, seaweed,
clams

Kwakiutl

Migrated to
northwestern part
of US---Oregon,
Washington, and
Idaho

**Nez
Perce**

The climate is very hot, dry
summers to moderately
cold winters with snow, the
higher the elevation, the
colder the temperatures;
Always lots of rain

Nez Perce

Wore breechcloth,
buckskin shirt with long
fringe, leggings, belts,
and moccasins. Women
wore long buckskin
dresses.

Nez Perce

Lived in
long-houses
and pit-houses

Nez Perce

Ate salmon and other
fish, bear, deer, elk,
buffalo (after getting
horses), rabbits,
squirrels, roots, nuts,
seeds, and berries

Nez Perce

Migrated to
central US

Pawnee

The climate is cold in
the winter with snow,
extremely hot and
humid in the summer.
Very windy and
occasional dust storms

Pawnee

Wore loincloth, animal
skin leggings, skirts,
beaded blouse with
fringe, fur robes,
moccasins,
headdresses

Pawnee

Lived in round
grass earth-lodges
and teepees when
they hunted

Pawnee

Grew corn, beans,
squash, pumpkins,
sunflowers, plus other
crops, collected wild
foods, hunted buffalo,
antelope, elk

Pawnee

Migrated to south
Florida into the
swamp lands of
the Everglades

Seminole

Climate was hot, humid,
rainy and lots of fog.
Temperatures near 90
in the summer and 70 in
the winter

Seminole

Wore breechcloths,
leggings, patterned
shirt, wrap-around skirt,
shawl, beads, nothing at
all for young kids

Seminole

Lived in wattle
and daub with
chickees
(raised floor)

Seminole

Grew beans, corn, pumpkins,
melons, sweet potatoes,
gathered roots, and picked
oranges, pineapples, and wild
berries, hunted animals like
rabbits, turkey, quail, deer and
bear, fished too
